

NDI performs at Symphony Space

On Nov. 1, at Peter Jay Sharpe Theater at Peter Norton Symphony Space on Manhattan's Upper West Side, National Dance Institute's Celebration Team, NDI's most advanced dancers, brought another exuberant, multi-cultural performance to the stage.

Back by popular demand, for the fourth year in a row, more than 50 children, ages eight to 15, performed original choreography highlighted by colorful costumes and live music.

The performance featured excerpts from NDI's acclaimed 2008 Event of the Year, Volando a México, an original musical production inspired by a partnership formed by NDI and ConArte in Mexico City that explores the culture of Mexico, as well as selected works from NDI's repertory, and a preview of the 2008-2009 season celebrating the life and music of John Lennon.

This performance is part of the Just Kidding! series, designed to bring exciting weekly children's events to Symphony Space.

Symphony Space fosters artistically and culturally diverse performing arts, literacy, and film programs that bring artists together in an atmosphere of exploration and intimacy.
