2010


NDI purchases an 18,000-square-feet space in Harlem that will serve as the organization's permanent home.

1999

The **1999 Event of the Year:** *Step by Step by Ellington* is conceived and directed by Ellen Weinstein.

1998

Jacques d'Amboise is awarded the **National Medal of Arts** by President Clinton.

NDI's **Teacher Training program** is established.

The 1998 Event of the Year: City, City, directed by Ellen Weinstein, takes place for the first time at LaGuardia High School for the Performing Arts.

1997

Jacques d'Amboise and Dufftin Garcia travel to **Tel Aviv** and the West Bank for an international residency.

The **1997 Event of the Year: Dancing up a Story** takes place at The Delacorte Theater.

1996

President Clinton and the First Lady invite NDI children to perform in the Rose Garden at the **White House** for the Greek State Dinner.

The 1996 Event of the Year: This Joint is Jumpin' is directed by Ellen Weinstein.

1995

Jacques d'Amboise is awarded the **Kennedy Center Honors**, the same year Ellen Weinstein is named Artistic Director.

The 1995 Event of the Year: Fat City takes place for the first time in Central Park at the The Delacorte Theater.

26 NDI dancers perform at the 50th Anniversary of the United Nations in Geneva, Switzerland, underwritten by the Japanese company Felissimo.

1994

Children from the earth's geological extremes take part in the 1994 Event of the Year: Rosebud's Song.

The Irene Diamond Fund establishes ongoing, multi-year support for **NDI's Summer Institute**.

1993

Phil Donahue invites NDI children to perform with him for his 25th anniversary television show.

NDI returns to Madison Square Garden with the **1993 Event of the Year:** Amerimusica II.

1992

The 1992 Event of the Year: Amerimusica, directed by Ellen Weinstein, celebrates the widely varied cultures of the Americas during the past 500 years and features original music by David Amram.

1991

June 3, 1991 is declared "National Dance Institute Day" by New York City Mayor Rudolph W. Giuliani.

More than 1,500 children, including dancers from Madras, India, perform for two weeks at Brooklyn Academy of Music in the 1991 Event of the Year: Chakra starring Malika Sarabai.

1989

NDI's **Adopt-A-School program** is launched.

An NDI associate program, Trenton Educational Dance Institute, is founded.

The **1989 Event of the Year:** *Meilleurs Amis* features scenery and sets by Red Grooms.

1988

The **NDI Alumni Association** is founded.

NDI partners with **Very Special Arts** to create a dance program for children who are blind or visually impaired.

Jacques d'Amboise directs the 1988 Event of the Year: A Day in the Life of Coney Island with the North Bondi Lifesaving Team from Australia as guests.

1987

A Celebration of Literature unites important American writers, composers, visual artists, and choreographers to create short, theatrical ballets for children. "We Real Cool" is created















from the poem by Gwendolyn Brooks, and is filmed in a vacant lot in New York City's Lower East side, with a backdrop mural designed by Red Grooms.

The 1987 Event of the Year: A Celtic Tale takes place at Madison Square Garden and features a moveable sculpture by Helena Blumenfeld.

1986

NDI does its first cultural exchange with China, and 56 children from China come to NYC to perform with 1,500 NDI dancers in the 1986 Event of the Year: China Dig.

1985

1,500 children perform in the 1985 Event of the Year: Andrew Jackson and the Battle of New Orleans, which stars Donlin Foreman and Ann Reinking.

NDI holds a school-wide residency at P.S. 29 in Brooklyn and premieres the work *The Shooting of Dan McGrew*, featuring original music by Galt McDermott and underwritten by Joseph Papp.

1984

The **1984 Event of the Year:** *The Knack*, with scenery by Red Grooms, features Richard Kiley and Chloris Leachman.

1983

The 1983 Event of the Year: The Three Musketeers, inspired by the Alexandre Dumas adventure story, features over 1,000 children at Madison Square Garden's Felt Forum.

1982

During the 1982 Event of the Year: Fat City, Christopher d'Amboise, Judy Collins, Patricia McBride, Mary Tyler Moore, John Schuck, Janet Eilber, Kevin Kline and The NYPD Dancing Police join 1,000 NDI children on stage at Madison Square Garden's Felt Forum. The Event is filmed as part of the documentary "He Makes Me Feel Like Dancin."

1981

Nancy Reagan invites Jacques d'Amboise and a group of hearing and hearing-impared NDI children to the **White House** at holiday time for a demonstration of NDI teaching methods.

Over 1,000 children perform in the 1981 Event of the Year: Texas Duke. Jacques d'Amboise writes, choreographs, and directs this spoof of a border town incident in a saloon on the Rio Grande. New York City Police perform with New York City Ballet dancers to a song written by Balanchine.

1980

The **1980 Event of the Year:** *Big Mama* features 800 NDI dancers and is co-hosted by Judy Collins and Tony Randall.

1979

Christopher d'Amboise, Mikhail Baryshnikov, Judy Collins, and Patricia McBride join 400 boys and girls for the **1979 Event of the Year** at Madison Square Garden's Felt Forum.

1978

The 1978 Event of the Year: Dance Space takes place at New York State Theater, and 100 dancing boys participate.

1977

The first annual NDI **Event of the Year:** *Dance on a May Day*takes place at New York State
Theater, between the matinee
and evening performances. 30
boys participate.

1976

NDI is founded by New York City Ballet principal dancer Jacques d'Amboise.
