

JACQUES D'AMBOISE

(Founder, NDI) is a director, teacher, and world-renowned ballet dancer and choreographer. He became a member of New York

City Ballet at age 15 and was promoted to principal dancer at 17. At the age of 50, he retired from the stage. During his 33-year career, Mr. d'Amboise originated numerous roles in ballets by George Balanchine. Mr. d'Amboise is known for his definitive performance in Balanchine's ballet "Apollo." Mr. d'Amboise founded National Dance Institute in 1976. Its purpose is to inspire children to excellence using the arts, with dance as the catalyst. NDI and its associate programs have reached over 2 million children... and counting! A documentary film about his work, "He Makes Me Feel Like Dancin'," won the Academy Award for Best Documentary Feature in 1984, and he has received many honors, including the Kennedy Center Honors, the National Medal of the Arts, and the MacArthur Genius Award.



JOHN LITHGOW

(Actor) John Lithgow's roots are in the theater. In 1973, he won a Tony Award three weeks after his Broadway debut, in David Storey's "The Changing Room."

Since then he has appeared on Broadway twenty more times, earning five more Tony nominations, another Tony, four Drama Desk Awards, and induction into the Theatre Hall of Fame. Lithgow has acted in England with both the Royal Shakespeare Company and the National Theatre. Lithgow recently returned to Broadway in "Hillary and Clinton" in April 2019. In the early 1980's, Lithgow began to make a major mark in film. He was nominated for Oscars for "The World According to Garp" and "Terms of Endearment." He has appeared in over forty-five films. Lithgow has been nominated

for twelve Emmy Awards for his work on television. He has won six, including three for his work on the hit NBC comedy series "3rd Rock from the Sun." Lithgow won his latest Emmy for his role as Winston Churchill in "The Crown." Since 1998 he has written nine New York Times best-selling children's picture books. In 2011, HarperCollins published Lithgow's memoir, "Drama: An Actor's Education," presenting his life and career up to the age of 35. Last year, Lithgow released the New York Times Bestseller, "Dumpty: The Age of Trump in Verse." John Lithgow was born in Rochester, New York, but grew up in Ohio. He graduated from high school in Princeton, New Jersey, attended Harvard College, and studied at the London Academy of Music & Dramatic Art on a Fulbright Grant.



DANIEL ULBRICHT

(Dancer) is a Principal Dancer with New York City Ballet and the founder and director of Stars of the American Ballet, a company that tours nationally and

internationally and is devoted to presenting high caliber dance performances and offering educational and outreach programs. Ulbricht is the Artistic Advisor to Manhattan Youth Ballet and the Associate Artistic Director of the New York State Summer School for the Arts in Saratoga Springs, NY. A guest teacher at the School of American Ballet and Ballet Academy East, he also teaches at many well-known dance schools, private schools and universities throughout the United States. He is also the founder and director of Dance Against Cancer.



BILLY PORTER

(Actor and Singer) attended the Musical Theater program at Pittsburgh Creative and Performing Arts School's School of Drama, graduated from

Carnegie Mellon University School of Drama, and achieved fame performing on Broadway before starting a solo career as a singer and actor. Porter won the 2013 Best Actor in a Musical for his role as Lola in "Kinky Boots" at the 67th Tony Awards. For the role, Porter also won the Drama Desk Award for Outstanding Actor in a Musical and Outer Critics Circle Award for Outstanding Actor in a Musical. In 2014 Porter won the Grammy Award for Best Musical Theater Album for "Kinky Boots." He currently stars in the television series "Pose," for which he was nominated for a Golden Globe Award and won the 2019 Primetime Emmy Award for Outstanding Lead Actor in a Drama Series, becoming the first openly gay Black man to be nominated and win in any lead acting category at the Primetime Emmys. Porter is included in Time magazine's 100 Most Influential People of 2020.



ANTONINA SKOBINA

(Dancer) was born in Ukraine. Since the age of seven, she has been receiving the best ballroom dance training in Ukraine, Germany,

England, and the United States. She is a two-time US National Ballroom Dance Champion and a World Championship Bronze Medalist. She is also a Blackpool Rising Stars Latin Winner, which is the most prestigious Ballroom dance competition in the world. Together with Denys Drozdyuk, Antonina co-founded a collaborative ballroom dance duet called "DNA," a name under which both participated on NBC's Hit Television Show "World of Dance" for two seasons, where they represented Ballroom Dance. Antonina performs frequently as a Guest Artist with the Stars of American Ballet and in various International Ballet Galas, Festivals, and Productions worldwide. Apart from dancing, Antonina has a great passion for acting and she is a graduate of the New York Film Academy. Antonina is also a gifted Ballroom Dance teacher and evidence of her work is training US National Ballroom Dance Champions including children and youth.



DENYS DROZDYUK

(Dancer) Denys
Drozdyuk started
dancing at the age of
four in Ukraine. From
then on he has been
continuously trained
in ballroom dance.

He holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Dance from the Juilliard School and a Master of Arts Degree in Dance Education from New York University. Together with Antonina Skobina, Denys co-founded a collaborative ballroom dance duet called "DNA," a name under which both participated on NBC's Hit Television show "World of Dance" for two seasons, where they represented Ballroom Dance. Being a versatile dancer, Denys is also a winner of "So You Think You Can Dance" Canada Television Show. Some of his ballroom dance achievements include: three time World Ballroom 10-Dance Champion, two-time USA National Ballroom Dance Champion, seven-time German National Ballroom Dance Champion, three-time Canadian National Ballroom Dance Champion and a Blackpool Dance Festival Winner. Denys performs frequently as a Guest Artist with the "Stars of American Ballet" and in various International Ballet Galas, Festivals, and Productions worldwide. He also teaches workshops and master classes throughout the world.



CHITA RIVERA

(Actress, Singer, and Dancer) is a theatrical icon and one of Broadway's greatest triple-threat talents, Chita Rivera is one of the most nominated

performers in Tony Award history having earned ten nominations, won twice and received the 2018 Special Tony Award for Lifetime Achievement in the Theatre. A versatile actress/singer/dancer, her most recent starring roles include "The Visit," the final

John Kander/Fred Ebb/Terrence McNally musical directed by John Doyle and choreographed by Graciela Daniele on Broadway; the Broadway revival of "The Mystery of Edwin Drood"; the Broadway and touring productions of "The Dancer's Life," a dazzling musical celebrating her spectacular career, written by Terrence McNally and directed by Graciela Daniele and the revival of the Broadway musical "Nine" with Antonio Banderas. She trained as a ballering (from age nine) before receiving a scholarship to the School of American Ballet from the legendary choreographer George Balanchine. Chita's first appearance (age 17) was as a principal dancer in "Call Me Madam." Her electric performance as Anita in the original Broadway premiere of "West Side Story" brought her stardom, which she repeated in London, Chita was awarded The Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Barack Obama in 2009 and received the coveted Kennedy Center Honors in 2002. In 2019, Chita performed her solo concert at London's Cadogan Hall; in 2018 she was honored as a Living Landmark by the New York Landmarks Conservancy; in 2016 she headlined at Carnegie Hall; and in 2015, Great Performances aired their special "Chita Rivera: A Lot of Livin' To Do," a retrospective of her extraordinary life and career nationally on PBS. Her current solo CD is entitled "And Now I Swing." Her most treasured production is her daughter, singer/dancer/choreographer Lisa Mordente.



ARIANA DEBOSE

(Actress, Singer, and Dancer) is a Tonynominated actress known for her varying roles on stage as well as on screen. DeBose is perhaps best known for her role as Disco Donna

in "Summer: The Donna Summer Musical," which earned her a 2018 Tony Award nomination for Best Featured Actress in a Musical. For the same role, she was

nominated for a Drama League Award for Distinguished Performance and won a Chita Rivera Award for Outstanding Female Dancer in a Broadway Show. DeBose recently wrapped production on Ryan Murphy's Netflix adaptation of the hit Broadway musical "The Prom," where she stars as Alyssa alongside Meryl Streep, Nicole Kidman, and James Corden. In December, DeBose will be seen in Steven Spielberg's highly anticipated reimagining of the Academy Award-winning musical "West Side Story." DeBose was chosen from thousands of actresses to portray the iconic role of "Anita," which earned Rita Moreno an Oscar in 1962. In 2015, DeBose appeared alongside Lin-Manuel Miranda in the groundbreaking, Tony-winning musical "Hamilton" as a member of the original cast in both the Broadway and Off-Broadway productions. After her departure from "Hamilton" in 2016, DeBose completed a run as Jane in the original Broadway cast of "A Bronx Tale." Her additional theater credits include: Leading Player in the Tony Award-winning revival of "Pippin," Mary Wilson of the Supremes in "Motown The Musical," Nautica in Andy Blankenbuehler's "Bring It On: The Musical" and ensemble in Stephen Sondheim's "Company."



MANDY PATINKIN

(Actor) has been fortunate to carve out a varied career including theater, the concert stage, film, television, and as a recording artist. In his 1980

Broadway debut, Mandy won a Tony Award for his role as Che in "Evita," and he was nominated in 1984 for his starring role in the musical, "Sunday in the Park with George." In 1989, Mandy began his concert career at The Public Theater. Since then he has toured (and continues to) his solo concerts. In 1997, he played a sold-out Broadway engagement of "Mandy Patinkin in Concert," with all profits benefiting five charitable organizations. In

addition to his solo concerts, Mandy has created collaborations with artists including: opera super-star Nathan Gunn; Patti LuPone; and Taylor Mac. Mandy's newest feature film "Before You Know It," debuted August 2019 in NYC and Los Angeles. In television, Mandy won a 1995 Emmy Award for his performance in the CBS series "Chicago Hope." He recently completed eight seasons of the Award-winning Showtime Original Series "Homeland." As a recording artist on CBS Records, Mandy released two solo albums, "Mandy Patinkin" and "Mandy Patinkin In Concert: Dress Casual." Mandy resides in NYC with his wife, actress and writer Kathryn Grody.



KATHRYN GRODY

(Actress) is from Los Angeles and upon arrival in New York City, found herself employed on Broadway in "Scapino." She has worked extensively

Off-Broadway, winning Obie Awards for performances in Caryl Churchill's "Top Girls" and Christopher Durang's "The Marriage of Bette and Boo." Grody earned a Drama Desk nomination for performance in her autobiographical show "A Mom's Life" examining the pros and cons of what happens when an award-winning actress sets her career aside and becomes a stay-home mother. She was recently seen as Gaby in Susan Miller's "20th Century Blues" at Signature Theater. Her film credits include "The Lemon Sisters," "My Bodyguard," "Harry and Walter Go To New York," "Reds," and "Men With Guns." Her TV work includes "The Sunset Gang" and "Execution of Private Slovik." Her essays have appeared in "Harper's Bazaar," "Mountain Record" and "Oprah." The narrative version of "A Mom's Life" was published by Avon. She is on the board of Dances For A Variable Population and Downtown Women For Change, and is a Usual Suspect with New York Theatre Workshop. She has been married to Mandy Patinkin since 1980. They have two children.



LÉONARDO SANDOVAL

(Dancer) is a Brazilian tap dancer and choreographer. He is renowned for blending America's great tap tradition with Brazil's rich rhythmic

and musical heritage. A true dancer-musician, he is in demand as a solo performer, choreographer, and educator, and is a core member of acclaimed company Dorrance Dance. He and composer Gregory Richardson direct Music From The Sole, a tap dance and live music company that celebrates tap's Afro-diasporic roots, its lineage to forms like house dance and hip hop, and its unique blend of sound and movement. Léonardo's work has been presented at venues including Lincoln Center, National Folk Festival, Jacob's Pillow, and the Guggenheim Museum. Léonardo is a passionate believer in the transformational power of dance and music, and he is proud and honored to contribute to the extraordinary work of National Dance Institute as their inaugural Artist-in-Residence.



LLOYD KNIGHT

(Dancer) is a Principal Dancer with the Martha Graham Dance Company. Having joined in 2005, he performs the major male roles of the Graham

repertory including in "Appalachian Spring," "Embattled Garden," "Night Journey" and many others. "Dance Magazine" named him one of the "Top 25 Dancers to Watch" in 2010 and one of the best performers of 2015. Mr. Knight has starred with ballet greats Wendy Whelan and Misty Copeland in signature Graham duets. He has had roles created for him by such renowned artists as Nacho Duato and Pam Tanowitz. He is currently a principal guest artist for The Royal Ballet of Flanders directed by Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui. Born in England and raised in Miami, he trained at Miami Conservatory of Ballet and New World School of the Arts.



BLAKELEY WHITE-MCGUIRE (Dancer) is an award-winning dancer, choreographer, répétiteur, and educator. She is a Principal Guest Artist and former Principal Dancer of

Martha Graham Dance Company (2001 to 2016, 2017). She earned her MFA in Interdisciplinary Arts from Goddard College, Vermont and currently serves on the faculties of Hunter College, The Ailey School, Taylor School, the American Dance Festival and as guest artist at Fiorello H. LaGuardia Hiah School of Music & Art and Performing Arts. Blakeley is an official Regisseur for the Martha Graham Center staging repertory internationally; most recently for Paul Taylor's American Modern Dance, Semperoper, Ballet Vlaanderen and Juilliard. Blakeley currently performs and choreographs with the inter-genre/generational dance collective Movement Migration, Buglisi Dance Theatre, and serves as NYC Department of Education facilitator for professional development in Dance Education



LORENZO PAGANO

(Dancer) is a native from Torino, Italy. He has been dancing for the Martha Graham Dance Company in New York for a decade embodying the majority

of Principal Dancer roles of the repertory ("Appalachian Spring," "Cave of the Heart," "Diversion of Angels," "El Penitente," "Embattled Garden" and "Night Journey" to name a few). Mr Pagano has also danced starring roles for new works by Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui, Lucinda Childs, Nacho Duato, Andonis Foniadakis, Pontus Lidberg, Bulareyaung Pagarlava, Troy Schumacher, and Sonya Tayeh. He has been a Guest Artist for the Lar Lubovitch Dance Company and Ballet Collective. He is a performer for Movement Migration, and he has danced

with Paris Opera 'forme' étoile and Artistic Director Aurélie Dupont in Martha Graham's "Lament." He has partnered Miami City Ballet and Béjart Ballet Principal Dancer Myrna Kamara in Martha Graham's "Moon Duet." In July 2016, Pagano was honored with the Italian International Dance Award as Male Rising Star.



CHARLOTTE
D'AMBOISE (Actress,
Singer, and Dancer)
just concluded a run
as Mrs. Mullins in
"Carousel" at Chicago's
Lyric Opera. She had
previously starred on
Broadway in the Tony-

winning revival of "Pippin" as Fastrada, a role for which she received an Outer Critics Circle Award nomination and won the Fred Astaire Award. Previously, she could be seen as Roxie Hart in the Broadway hit "Chicago," and as Cassie in the critically acclaimed Broadway revival of "A Chorus Line." Born in New York, Ms. d'Amboise made her Broadway debut in "Cats" in 1983. Ms. d'Amboise's extensive Broadway credits include her Tony-nominated performance in "Jerome Robbins' Broadway," Lola in "Damn Yankees," the Wife in Susan Stroman's critically acclaimed "Contact," and Kathy in the Roundabout Theatre's revival of "Company." The original Broadway productions of "Carrie," "Song and Dance," and the role of Claudine in the City Center Encores presentation of "Can-Can" are among her other Broadway credits. In the spring of 2005, Ms. d'Amboise replaced an injured Christina Applegate in the pre-Broadway and Broadway revival of "Sweet Charity." Once Applegate returned, d'Amboise remained as her standby while simultaneously performing the role of Roxie Hart in "Chicago." She has received the Fred Astaire Award for Achievement in Dance for her performances in "Damn Yankees," "Sweet Charity" and "Chicago"; the Bay Area Theatre Critics Circle Award for "Chicago"; the LA Ovation

Award for Leading Actress in a Musical for "Chicago"; and the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circles Award for Leading Performance in "Chicago." Ms. d'Amboise's film credits include "The In Crowd," "American Blue Note," "Just Off The Coast," "The Preacher's Wife," the acclaimed documentary "Every Little Step," and "Frances Ha." On television, she has appeared in "The Kennedy Center Honors," "Law and Order," a videotaped performance of the Broadway musical "Contact," and made-for-TV movies. She is proud to be co-founder and co-artistic director with husband Terrence Mann of the Triple Arts Musical Theatre Intensive



TERRENCE MANN

(Actor and Singer) is a three-time Tony nominee. His credits include work on the Broadway stage, in film, and on television as a director, composer and artistic director. He

most recently was Jerry Springer in The New Group New York premiere of "Jerry Springer: The Opera" at Signature Theatre. On Broadway, he's won the Outer Critics Circle Award and was nominated for a Tony for his portrayal of King Charlemagne in the hit musical "Pippin." Most recently, he created the role of The Man in the Yellow Suit in Broadway's "Tuck Everlasting" and played Charles Frohman/Hook in "Finding Neverland." He originated the roles of the Beast in "Beauty and the Beast" (Tony, Drama Desk, Outer Critics Circle nominations), Inspector Javert in "Les Misérables" (Tony nomination), Rum Tum Tugger in "Cats" and Chauvelin in "The Scarlet Pimpernel." Other Broadway credits include "The Addams Family" (Mal Beineke), "Lennon" (Ensemble), "The Rocky Horror Show" (Frank-N-Furter), "Getting Away With Murder "(Greg), "A Christmas Carol" (Scrooge), "Rags" (Saul), "Barnum" (Ringmaster, matinee Barnum on tour), "Jerome Robbins' Broadway" (Narrator) and "Jekyll and Hyde"

(title roles, pre-Broadway workshop). Terry can be seen as Mr. Whispers in Season 2 of the Netflix Original series "Sense8." He appeared as Bob on the Sci-Fi Channel's series "The Dresden Files." He was the Director/Composer for the musical adaptation of "Romeo & Juliet." He was founding Artistic Director of the Carolina Arts Festival. He also served as Artistic Director of the North Carolina Theatre for ten years. He now serves as the endowed chair of Musical Theatre at Western Carolina University and is the Artistic Director of the Connecticut Repertory Theatre's Nutmeg Summer Series on the campus of the University of Connecticut. Students are engaging with NDI through live, synchronous classes, recorded videos, and virtual performances. Through ndiMOVES, we also offer customized, remote programming for school districts, charter school networks, and education organizations who are looking to incorporate the socialemotional benefits of the arts into their distance learning instruction. NDI fulfills our mission by offering our core programs to all children free of charge. Our inclusive In-School Program in New York City public schools ensures success for every child. Our Advanced Programs give our most motivated children the opportunity to deepen their dance and music study by joining our SWAT Team or Celebration Team, and by attending our Irene Diamond Summer Institute. The NDI DREAM Project (Dancers Realize Excellence through Arts and Movement) is our inclusive dance program providing children with and without disabilities the opportunity to perform. Videos in our DREAM Project@Home

and **ndiLIVE!** series bring dance and movement class to the public via social media.

NDI disseminates our acclaimed teaching method through the NDI Collaborative for Teaching & Learning, a professional development program for teaching artists, dance educators, musicians, and organizations worldwide. Every year, professional artists and educators from around the globe participate in our trainings and emerge from this transformative experience with an advanced set of teaching tools and a deepened understanding of the power of the arts in education.

Throughout our history, NDI has seeded programs both nationally and internationally.
